This is a 2-year immersion program. The Year 1 experience, Classroom in the Field, starts on June 19, 2016. Doris Duke Conservation Scholars will have all travel, food and lodging paid during their 8-week summer experience, and will receive a weekly stipend of \$500. Year 2 Scholars will join a Conservation Practice Team, where they will be paired up with conservation professionals and academics for a 8 week team internship.
